

Coins for Cats

We feel our Coins for Cats program, along with our Live Cat presentation, benefits kids and adults on many levels. We seek to pique their curiosity of the natural world around them and inspire questions and possible solutions to the conservation issues occurring world-wide. We hope this will encourage a spirit of awareness and activism on a broad scale in their communities, country, and world.

Cat Haven responsibilities:

- Provide information on selected conservation or research projects supported by Project Survival which kids can contribute additional funding to.
- Collect all coins collected at conclusion of Coins for Cats drive and deposit funds in bank.
 Funds will be sent to ear-marked project, if specified by the school, or used for any conservation or research project currently in need of supplies.
- Provide at least one follow up information packet outlining where the money went and what it accomplished.

School responsibilities:

- Provide receptacle in each classroom to collect Coins for Cats. Coins drive can be done on a school-wide basis or just in the classrooms that are participating in the Cat assembly. Receptacles can be any container of any size. We encourage your classes to decorate these containers and come up with fun challenges for each day (ie, who can find the most coins under the couch cushions, in the laundry, etc.)
- Each class can select a project to work for or the school as a whole can select a project to work for. All coins collected will be used exclusively for the selected project(s). If no project is selected, the funds will be used for conservation or research project(s) at Project Survival's discretion.
- Coins for Cats drive should run a minimum of two weeks; there is no minimum or maximum requirement for how much money is raised.
- Provide minimum 48 hours notice for event cancellation. If proper notice is not given, school will be responsible to pay invoice in full as if event did occur.

Purpose of the Coins for Cats program:

• Empower kids of all ages to realize that even kids can make a difference, especially when working for a common goal.

Presentation Requirements:

- Projector and Screen for Power Point slide show.
- 6' 8' rectangular table

- Area behind presentation area/room beside presentation area or access to park our vehicle next to presentation area to keep our cat(s) prior to coming "on stage"
- Presentation area with entrance which allows us to enter without walking through the kids. Please let us know if you do not have any of these items prior to the scheduled date so we can discuss other options. **Thank you**
